Tech Behavior Violations

- ▶ Email, instant messaging, internet surfing
- ▶ Letting someone copy your document
- ▶ Damaging your laptop
- ▶ Accessing inappropriate materials
- ▶ Not bringing a charged laptop

“Traditional” violation

- ▶ Passing notes, reading magazines
- ▶ Sharing your paper to allow someone to copy
- ▶ Damaging textbooks
- ▶ Bringing inappropriate material
- ▶ Not bringing your binder or homework

Policy & Procedures 2022

8 Big Ideas

- ▶ Lists acceptable and unacceptable use
- ▶ Internet safety
- ▶ Filtering and monitoring-Children's Internet Protection Act (CIPA)
- ▶ Internet safety education
- ▶ Copyright & Ownership of Work
- ▶ Network Security, Student data is confidential
- ▶ No Expectation of Privacy (district has access)
- ▶ Disciplinary Action – violations may be cause for disciplinary action

Troubleshooting

- ▶ Students will learn how to do basic troubleshooting
- ▶ Students will save a troubleshooting guide on their desktop
- ▶ Support beyond troubleshooting will be available at each school
- ▶ Loaner laptops will be available for students

Yikes! I broke it!!

- ▶ Anacortes visited and talked to several school districts to learn how they handled damages. Our policy is comparable to many districts across the state and country.
- ▶ An accident is different than gross negligence or not reporting a stolen computer.
- ▶ The district reserves the right to charge the user the full cost for repair or replacement when damage or loss occurs due to gross negligence as determined by school administrators.
- ▶ \$30 insurance/usage fee, \$100 deductible. Many textbooks cost about \$100.
- ▶ The student will be issued a loaner so learning is not interrupted.
