



DEAR ANACORTES COMMUNITY MEMBER,



On February 8, 2022, the district will place two ballot measures before voters to maintain support for local schools.

Both measures are replacement levies, taking the place of expiring levies approved by voters in 2018. The combined, estimated rate of \$1.28 per \$1,000 valuation is 32 cents lower than previously approved rates in 2018.

The two measures, a replacement Educational Programs and Operations Levy (EPO), and a replacement Technology and Capital Levy will help maintain school services that are not provided by the state.

The local EP&O levy funding allows our schools to continue providing quality education services, such as smaller class sizes, Career & Technical Education, Advanced Placement courses, mental health support, athletics, activities, and more. The estimated rate for the EP&O levy is \$0.93 per \$1,000 of assessed property value.

The Replacement Technology and Capital levy will provide necessary funding to maintain students' access to technology, such as laptops, online curricula, and technology specialists to support teaching and learning. Capital improvements will include needed updates to our buildings to improve energy efficiency, increase safety, and maintain building longevity. The estimated rate for the Replacement Technology and Capital levy is \$0.35 per \$1,000 of assessed property value.

Our district was able to respond to the pandemic thanks to this community's support of technology levies in the past. This funding maintains the necessary tools that students need to

be successful 21st century learners. We also take great pride in our buildings and grounds, and need to be able to maintain them for decades to come.

This brochure outlines the two levies, our district's high quality standards, and our vision for the future. We appreciate your careful consideration of these two ballot measures.

BALLOT LANGUAGE

PROPOSITION NO. 1 ANACORTES SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 103 REPLACEMENT EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS AND OPERATIONS LEVY

The Board of Directors of Anacortes School District adopted Resolution No. 945 concerning educational funding. This proposition authorizes the District to levy the following excess taxes to replace an expiring levy on all taxable property within the District to support the District's educational programs and operations not funded or fully funded by the state:

REPLACEMENT LEVY FOR TECHNOLOGY AND CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS


The Board of Directors of Anacortes School District adopted Resolution No. 946 concerning a capital projects and technology levy. This proposition would fund the acquisition, installation, and management of computer technology systems, including enhancing infrastructure, acquiring hardware, licensing software, purchasing online learning resources, staff technology training, capital equipment purchases and improvements to modernize facilities and safety systems, and authorizes the following excess levies for such purposes on all taxable property within the District:
